DNAA Netherwitton Field Shoot 2026, incorporating the NCAS Field Championships A World Record Status and Arrowhead Event Prospectus

Location	Netherwitton Woods, Netherwitton, near Morpeth, Northumberland. What3Words location – prowling.eradicate.discouraged
Dates	2 nd and 3 rd May 2026
Entry	£25 for two days [Senior] £15 single day [Senior] £18 for two days [Junior] £10 single day [Junior] Two day entries are given priority
Cancellations	No refunds will be available 28 days prior to the competition date
Registration & Assembly	Registration and equipment inspection from 8:30am. Assembly 09:30am both days. Membership cards or proof of affiliation to World Archery will be required.
Round	Sat. WA 24 unmarked, Sun. WA 24 marked
Judges	Chairman: Tony Tideswell, assisted by: Dave Crow, David Potts, Lynne Nicholson and Ken Milner
Practice	Practice targets will be available from 8:00am on Saturday & Sunday Practice targets will also be available on Friday evening from 5:00pm until 8:00pm
Eligibility	To shoot this event, archers must have a current Archery ^{GB} membership. Medals will be awarded to archers shooting the recognized categories of American Flatbow (AFB), Asiatic, Barebow (BB), Compound Barebow (CBB), Compound Limited (CL), Compound Unlimited (CUL), Recurve (Rec), Longbow (LB) and Traditional (Trad), as defined by Archery ^{GB} .
Senior Awards	DNAA County Championship titles will be awarded to DNAA members across categories. NCAS Championship titles to be awarded to NCAS members across categories. Visitor medals will be awarded in all categories. Medals will be awarded according to the number of entries: 1– 3 entries = 1 medal. 4 – 7 entries = 2 medals, 8 or more entries = 3 medals. Arrowhead awards: All classes and age groups must shoot as follows: Barebow – Blue pegs, Compound and Recurve – Red pegs. Intermediate Archers' round is the yellow peg and Novice Archers' round is the white peg. 50+: Additional medals will be given to senior entrants that are over 50
Junior Awards	Age is the age of the archer on the 31 st December THIS YEAR Awards will be awarded to Archers shooting in the following age group/peg combinations: With sights (CUL, CL, Rec): Red: U21/U18, Blue: U16, Yellow: U15, White: U14/U12 Without sights (AFB, Asiatic, BB, CBB, LB, Trad): Blue: U21/U18, Yellow: U16, White: U15/U14/U12
Junior Entrants	Please email the Tournament Organiser to confirm shooting group arrangements. Juniors should shoot with a nominated senior archer as their guardian for the day
Data Protection	By entering this tournament, you agree that information may be collected and shared with tournament Organiser, Archery GB and other competitors. Some information may also be published in documents or lists relating to the event at a schedule decided by the Organiser. These include the entrant's name, gender, age category, email addresses and/or contact numbers provided, club, county and any assigned codes for this information.
Refreshments	Bacon/sausage sandwiches as well as tea/coffee and a selection of sweets/chocolate/cake will be available throughout the day.
Spectators	Spectators may be allowed on certain parts of the course during the period of competition, but only if escorted and at the discretion of the Judges.
Dress	No camouflage. Archers are advised to wear colours which are clearly visible in woodland.
Drug Testing	This record status shoot will be liable for drug testing; competitors approached to give samples must comply. If they refuse, that refusal will be treated as a positive result. Entries from archers under 18 are considered to be approved by a parent/guardian, signifying their consent to their child being drug tested if approached.

Photography	In line with the recommendation in the Archery GB Safeguarding Children and Young People Policy, those who wish to take photographs at this event are to register with the Tournament Organiser on arrival. No unauthorised photography will be permitted. Please note in line with the Photographing & Filming Children & Young People in Sport policy you may be required to obtain written permission from the subject and/or their parents/carers to publish images on the internet or in print. Archers can now take pictures as long as they don't publish them on social media until after the event.
Parking	Car park is available in the field on the opposite side of the road to the shoot. Car park What3Words location is boarding.toolkit.witless .
Camping	Unfortunately, no camping is available at the venue, but there are several campsites nearby. Search for campsites near Netherwitton on https://www.pitchup.com/
Directions	From the A1, take the exit A197/A192, at the roundabout take the first exit onto Rose Street. In 0.1m turn right onto St Leonards Lane. In 0.3m turn left. 6 miles go through Netherwitton village. Watch for the yellow and black targets signifying the entrance to the car park after approx. 0.5m.
